The information below covers the period from 22nd April to 14th May 2022 with details provided in relation to the local priorities highlighted in the 2021-23 Local Police Plan for South Ayrshire.

Specific figures, stats and trends will continue to be provided at the Senior Management Scrutiny Board via the Partnership Panel.

<p>1. Serious and Organised Crime – (including Violence, Drug supply, Sexual Crime)</p>	<p>Violence For the reporting period we have dealt with 2 assaults and 2 serious assaults. Alcohol has played a factor in the serious assaults, and 1 occurred within a licensed premise. Enquiries are ongoing with positive lines of enquiry being followed up.</p> <p>Drugs Supply Proactive work targeting drug supply is ongoing, for the reporting period there has been very few calls from the community providing information in relation to drug activity. In relation to the calls received, information has been pulled and entered into our intelligence database and will be developed as appropriate.</p>
<p>2. Safer Communities (including Hate Crime, ASB, Domestic Abuse)</p>	<p>Nil</p> <p>Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) During the reporting period we have received a high number of calls in relation to calls linked to ASB.</p> <p>Public Nuisance type. Again, the majority of these calls were in relation to youth disorder. Prestwick Golf Club has been the subject of youth disorder as a repeat location.</p> <p>Prestwick Cross was subjected to ASB by youths whereby tulips were pulled and damaged from the flower beds. Through the local community providing CCTV footage and the campus officer becoming involved, he was able to identify the youths and is now carrying out restorative justice work with youths.</p> <p>We received a number of disturbance calls some involving reports of weapons which required an immediate response, these were at various locations.</p> <p>We continue to receive reports of noise complaints and neighbour disputes. A number of repeat locations were identified. These continue to be monitored by our ASB Team who work in partnership with South Ayrshire Council's Housing team and ASB Team. We are carrying out proactive joint visits with SAC at the earliest opportunity to try and prevent matters escalating.</p>

	Domestic Abuse This area of policing continues to be an area of focus, officers provide support to victims and ensure with consent of the victim they are referred to support agencies.	
3. Acquisitive Crime	Housebreaking	Nil
	Robbery	Nil
	Fraud	1 – this was in relation to an online scam where the victim is contacted in the pretence a family member requires money to be sent to them. Enquiries are ongoing.
4. Community Wellbeing	Substance Use We deal with a high number of incidents whereby substance misuse in relation to alcohol and or drugs is a factor. We work alongside partner agencies to refer individuals for further support. Children & Young People Nothing to report on of note for this meeting. Welfare Concerns We continue to respond to a high number of these types of incidents, which often take up a considerable amount of time of officers. These incidents can vary from persons suffering from mental health concerns to elderly members of the community requiring assistance. We work alongside partner agencies to deal with the incidents in a timeously manner as possible ensuring individuals speak with the relevant agency.	
5. Road Safety (Drink / Drug Driving, Speeding, Disqualified / Uninsured Driving)	We continue to receive a number of reports in relation to road safety. These range from speeding complaints, parking complaints, vehicle breakdowns. We have received further calls in relation to Dirt Bikes in the Moor Park area / Ardfind Road area. Enquiries continue to identify those responsible. Assistance has also been requested from Road Policing. Locality Officers will also deploy on quad bikes to this location.	
Up-coming events	Due to the better weather, we fully anticipate to see an increase in youth disorder type incidents. LPT officers will be deploying on quad bikes and bicycles in an attempt to engage with the youths and identify the ring leaders. LPT officers will also maintain links with the campus officer.
