Violence

There has been 3 reports of assault during the reporting period. For 2 of the assaults, offenders were identified and arrested and the third enquiries are ongoing. Alcohol was a factor. No serious injuries.

Drugs Supply

Proactive work targeting drug supply is ongoing, for the reporting period there has been very few calls from the community providing information in relation to drug activity. We welcome any information in relation to drug supply

2. Safer Communities (including Hate Crime, ASB, Domestic Abuse)

During the reporting period we received a report of racial abuse directed at a female, enquiries were carried out and 1 male was arrested and charged.

Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)

During the reporting period we have received a high number of calls in relation to calls linked to ASB.

For the reporting period, we received a high number of calls in relation to disturbances, noise complaints, neighbour disputes, public nuisance.

Reports were received of youths consuming alcohol and climbing onto the roof at the Indoor Bowling club. Officers attended, majority of youths made off, small number of youths that remained were spoken to.

For some of the disturbances reported to Police, a small number of these related to the behaviour of individuals at licensed premises. Alcohol was a factor and warnings given.

We continue to identify any repeat locations. These are monitored by our ASB Team who work in partnership with South Ayrshire Council's Housing team and ASB Team. We are carrying out proactive joint visits with SAC at the earliest opportunity to try and prevent matters escalating.

	Fraud	Local taxi driver reported female failing to pay taxi fare, female was traced and due to her conduct was arrested due to her demeanour and also charged with being racially abusive towards officers.
4. Community Wellbeing	Substance Use We deal with a high number of incidents whereby substance misuse in relation to alcohol and or drugs is a factor. We work alongside partner agencies to refer individuals for further support.

	Welfare Concerns We continue to respond to a high number of these types of incidents, which often take up a considerable amount of time of officers. These incidents can vary from persons suffering from mental health concerns to elderly members of the community requiring assistance. We work alongside partner agencies to deal with the incidents in a timeously manner as possible ensuring individuals speak with the relevant agency. We dealt with 11 incidents, 2 of which required an emergency response due to a number of factors.	
5. Road Safety (Drink / Drug Driving, Speeding, Disqualified / Uninsured Driving)	We continue to receive a number of reports in relation to road safety. These range from speeding complaints, parking complaints, vehicle breakdowns. We received a small number of complaints re: minor road crashes where driver error appears to be the common factor. During the reporting period, 1 male was reported for driving whilst under the influence of drugs and with no insurance.
