The information below covers the period from 15<sup>th</sup> March to 20<sup>th</sup> April 2023 with details provided in relation to the local priorities highlighted in the 2021-23 Local Police Plan for South Ayrshire.

Specific figures, stats and trends will continue to be provided at the Senior Management Scrutiny Board via the Partnership Panel.

1. Serious and Organised Crime – (including Violence, Drug supply, Sexual Crime)	<b>Violence</b> For the reporting period, officers have dealt with 5 reports of assault, for all minor injuries were sustained. For one of the incidents, an immediate police response was required resulting in 2 persons being arrested who thereafter assaulted the attending officers and resisted arrest. The other 4 assaults, they were all of a minor nature, no reoccurring theme.
	<b>Drugs Supply</b> Proactive work targeting drug supply is ongoing, for the reporting period there has been very few calls from the community providing information in relation to drug activity. We welcome any information in relation to drug supply. Officers have been proactive in utilising stop search powers when deemed necessary regarding drugs to target reports of drugs being used in licensed premises.

	There has been an increase in calls relating to youths causing annoyance at a number of locations in particular in the Marchburn area, Main Street and towards the beach.
	Youths have been stealing wheelie bins with the intention of setting fire to them as well as causing disturbances, drinking, smashing class etc.
	Locality Officers have reviewed the incidents to ascertain the most prevalent times / days in order to deploy at key times. With the summer approaching, it is anticipated youths will continue to congregate at hotspot locations and locality officers will deploy into these areas. There are also plans in place to utilise our Special Constables and deploy them into areas experiencing ASB in order that action can be taken.
	We have also received a number of complaints regarding the use of off road / scrambler bikes in multiple areas. A joint working group being led by South Ayrshire Council is being set up to target these complaints which is a common occurrence throughout South Ayrshire.

	We dealt with a number of disturbances for the reporting period, with many of them requiring an immediate Police response and appropriate action was taken. We continue to identify any repeat locations. These are monitored by our ASB Team who work in partnership with South Ayrshire Council's Housing team and ASB Team. We are carrying out proactive joint visits with SAC at the earliest opportunity to try and prevent matters escalating.
