The information below covers the period from 20/08/2023 to 11/09/23 with details provided in relation to the local priorities highlighted in the 2021-23 Local Police Plan for South Ayrshire.

Specific figures, stats and trends will continue to be provided at the Senior Management Scrutiny Board via the Partnership Panel.

<p>1. Serious and Organised Crime – (including Violence, Drug supply, Sexual Crime)</p>	<p>Violence</p> <p>Better month for Prestwick CC re: violence.</p> <p>1 report of an assault which required an immediate police response, targeted attack due to fall out between victim and suspect – crime report raised for Assault with Intent to Rob. Minimal injuries. Enquiries ongoing.</p> <p>2 further reports of assault, 1 of which involved children having a fall out at a play park, the other involved youths and another male. Enquiries are ongoing.</p> <p>Drugs Supply</p> <p>Proactive work targeting drug supply is ongoing, for the reporting period there has been very few calls from the community providing information in relation to drug activity. We welcome any information in relation to drug supply. Officers have been proactive in utilising stop search powers when deemed necessary regarding drugs to target reports of drugs being used in licensed premises.</p>
<p>2. Safer Communities (including Hate Crime, ASB, Domestic Abuse)</p>	<p>Nil</p> <p>Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)</p> <p>We continue to respond to a high number of calls linked to ASB; however, for the reporting period, this again has been a better month for Prestwick CC, in particular with the area being busier due to Prestfest. It's pleasing to see a drop in ASB type incidents.</p> <p>We did respond to 8 disturbances, 4 of which required an immediate Police response. For 1 a male was traced and warned re: his conduct. No repeat locations.</p> <p>We responded to 9 public nuisance type calls which is a drop from last month, repeat locations being Adamton Road South, Adamton Road North and Bellevue Crescent. Officers have spoken with complainers for these incidents and we will provide extra attention in the areas at key times.</p> <p>We have also received calls in relation to neighbour disputes and noise complaints. A number of these are repeat locations and we have carried out joint work along with SAC Housing and ASB Team.</p> <p>We continue to identify any repeat locations. These are monitored</p>

	<p>by our ASB Team who work in partnership with South Ayrshire Council's Housing team and ASB Team. We are carrying out proactive joint visits with SAC at the earliest opportunity to try and prevent matters escalating.</p> <p>Domestic Abuse This area of policing continues to be an area of focus, officers provide support to victims and ensure with consent of the victim they are referred to support agencies.</p>

4. Community Wellbeing	<p>Substance Use We deal with a high number of incidents whereby substance misuse in relation to alcohol and or drugs is a factor. We work alongside partner agencies to refer individuals for further support.</p> <p>Children & Young People Nothing to report on of note for this meeting.</p> <p>Welfare Concerns We continue to respond to a high number of these types of incidents, which often take up a considerable amount of time of officers. These incidents can vary from persons suffering from mental health concerns to elderly members of the community requiring assistance. We work alongside partner agencies to deal with the incidents in a timeously manner as possible ensuring individuals speak with the relevant agency.</p>						
5. Road Safety (Drink / Drug Driving, Speeding, Disqualified / Uninsured Driving)	<p>We continue to receive a number of reports in relation to road safety. These range from speeding complaints, parking complaints, vehicle breakdowns. We received a small number of complaints re: minor road crashes where driver error appears to be the common factor.</p> <p>Officers responded to a report of a RTC whereby a cyclist was struck by a car, driver of the car issued with a fixed penalty for careless driving, cyclist did not sustain any serious injuries.</p> <p>Officers also dealt with a male who was driving without a licence or insurance, his vehicle was seized and he was reported to the P.F.</p> <p>Officers have carried out road safety days of action; Prestwick was visited due to recent complaints, however when officers attended, no offences were detected. Further days of action will be carried out in the near future.</p>
