Violence

Better month for Prestwick CC re: violence.

1 report of an assault which required an immediate police response, targeted attack due to fall out between victim and suspect – crime report raised for Assault with Intent to Rob. Minimal injuries. Enquiries ongoing.

2 further reports of assault, 1 of which involved children having a fall out at a play park, the other involved youths and another male. Enquiries are ongoing.

Drugs Supply

Proactive work targeting drug supply is ongoing, for the reporting period there has been very few calls from the community providing information in relation to drug activity. We welcome any information in relation to drug supply. Officers have been proactive in utilising stop search powers when deemed necessary regarding drugs to target reports of drugs being used in licensed premises.

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

We continue to respond to a high number of calls linked to ASB; however, for the reporting period, this again has been a better month for Prestwick CC, in particular with the area being busier due to Prestfest. It's pleasing to see a drop in ASB type incidents.

We did respond to 8 disturbances, 4 of which required an immediate Police response. For 1 a male was traced and warned re: his conduct. No repeat locations.

We responded to 9 public nuisance type calls which is a drop from last month, repeat locations being Adamton Road South, Adamton Road North and Bellevue Crescent. Officers have spoken with complainers for these incidents and we will provide extra attention in the areas at key times.

We have also received calls in relation to neighbour disputes and noise complaints. A number of these are repeat locations and we have carried out joint work along with SAC Housing and ASB Team.

We continue to identify any repeat locations. These are monitored
